Impact

Retaining our after school coach was imperative to maintain the quality of after school sports offer. This contract is maintained through Sports Plus, which provide high-quality sports coaching. This has allowed us to broaden the range of sports on offer and also have a consistent presence in the development of after school sport.

New equipment has been purchased in order to widen the range of sports on offer. This year we have introduced archery, tag rugby, futsal, rounders and dance to add some more depth to the offer. We have also purchased spare shin pads, boots and other equipment to provide children with the correct equipment where necessary.

By joining Sainsbury's School Games we have been lucky enough to have access to a wide range of competitions in a huge range of sports, including dodgeball, tag rugby, capture the flag, swimming, cricket and netball. This has allowed us to improve our competitive sport offer massively and open up opportunities to all children. Transport costs have been shared between ourselves and Shireland Collegiate Academy.

We have also begun developing Change4life within school and we are trying to promote healthy eating throughout school. This is part of a wider drive in school to develop ourselves as a sporting hub in the local community.

Future Targets

- To continue to increase the offer of afterschool activities, giving opportunities and supporting working parents.
- To achieve our Silver Award in the Sainsbury's School Games.
- To develop links with local teams and sports providers in the local community.
