Impact

Our membership to the School Games has led to an unprecedented amount of competitive opportunities for children at George Betts. We have already taken part in a wide variety of sporting events, including Tennis, where we came second so now get to represent Sandwell in the Black Country Games, tri-golf, football, cricket and other events like capture the flag and tag rugby. This has resulted in children from all backgrounds and abilities to go offsite to fantastic venues and engage against children from other school in a safe and supportive environment. The links to growth mind-set, in terms of collaboration, perseverance and

Our project to develop the hall into a working classroom has come about from our development of the existing curriculum and our attempts to really promote health and well being in our learners. We aim to provide high quality lessons, backed up by ICT, using video content and information on how the body works and moves. The hall lacked any kind of ICT so the screen represents a huge step forward what we can offer during PE lessons. This will also last us several years so I feel it was a great investment that will enhance learning for years to come.

We have successfully run after school clubs for a while, but this year we have increased the number of children that are able to take part, meaning more children have opportunities to be active. We run a range of sports and options and have also collaborated with Mytime Active this year who are an external company that come in and run fitness sessions with both children and a parent, with a focus on nutrition and exercise.

Future Targets

- To secure Gold award in the School Games.
- Continue to develop links with external teams and organisations.
- To continue to promote wellness and healthy lifestyles to parents and children.
- To develop PE teaching practise to the next level, ensuring we are able to demonstrate progress in our children in terms of knowledge of their capabilities and their own physical fitness.
