

## Home/School Agreement

George Betts Primary Academy regards the relationship between your child's home and school to be of high importance and essential in helping your child to reach their full potential.

### In order to do this, families will:

- Bring your child to the Academy on time (by 8:45am) every day, or 8.30am for Morning Nursery and 12:30pm for afternoon Nursery
- Collect your child on time (at 3:30pm) every day, or 11:30am for morning Nursery
- Ensure your child attends school regularly and has an attendance of 95% or above within the year
- Ensure your child always wears the correct uniform
- Ensure your child always brings and wears the correct P.E. kit
- Complete homework weekly with your child to support their learning
- Read regularly with your child, returning Home Reading books when they have been finished
- Support the Academy with implementing the Behaviour Policy (*Refer to Policy in Induction Pack*)
- Talk to your child's class teacher if you have any concerns
- Provide the school with up to date contact information, including working telephone numbers
- Report any absences from school to the Main Office as early as possible
- Report any injuries that your child has sustained outside of school to Academy staff
- Work in partnership with school to implement their Child Protection & Safeguarding Policy (Available on the school website)
- Attend your child's FLiP workshops and Parents' Days
- Provide your child with healthy snacks for morning break and nutritious packed lunches
- Monitor children when using computer games and the internet at home, setting appropriate restrictions for your child's age

### The Academy will:

- Notify families of any key dates in advance
- Set homework weekly as outlined in the Academy's Homework Policy
- Change the children's Home Reading books regularly
- Implement the Academy's Behaviour Policy fairly and consistently
- Respond to any concerns raised by parents
- Support children and their families through Family Support and the Wellbeing Team
- Discuss any concerns with families as soon as possible, working in partnership with each other to implement our Child Protection & Safeguarding Policy
- Report any injuries your child has sustained in school either by phone call or at the end of the day
- Where there is a Child Protection & Safeguarding concern, report any unexplained injuries or concerns with children to outside agencies (including Social Services)
- Monitor your child's progress half termly and implement reading, writing and maths interventions as needed to best support your child progress
- Check contact numbers of all children regularly
- Provide healthy meals for all children having a school dinner
- Teach your child about online safety: including social media, emails and search engines
